MINUTES OF KNOWLTON TOWNSHIP WARREN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY March 23, 2017

The monthly meeting of the Knowlton Township Committee was held on this date at the Municipal Building, 628 Route 94, Columbia, New Jersey. This meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Starrs.

Mayor Starrs led the public in the pledge of allegiance.

The Mayor read the following statement in compliance with the "Open Public Meetings Act": "In accordance with Chapter 231 of the Public Laws of 1975, notice of this meeting was given by way of publication with the Star Gazette and/or the Express-Times, filed in the Municipal Clerk's Office and posted in the Knowlton Municipal Building."

Roll Call

Present: Deputy Mayor Cuntala, Committeeman Farber, Committeewoman Shipps, and Mayor Starrs Committeeman Van Horn was absent

Also present was Township Engineer Ted Rodman, DPW Supervisor Brian Peck

EXECUTIVE SESSION Motion to go into Closed Session: Mayor Starrs. Seconded by Committeewoman Cuntala and carried at 7:01.

Resolution

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meeting Act, Chapter 231, P.L.1975 permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting under certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Knowlton, in the County of Warren and State of New Jersey as follows:

Motion was made by Mayor Starrs, Seconded by Deputy Mayor Cuntala and carried to come out of Closed Session at 7:20 p.m. and return to Regular Session.

Trooper Rock from NJ State Police Hope Barracks was present at the meeting. Committeewoman Shipps addressed that a member of the recreation department believes he saw a drug transaction at Tunnel Field. Trooper Rock asked for the contact information of the member.

Presentation

John Kruk- Re/Max Town and Valley

Mr. Kruk spoke with the committee regarding renting out 622 Route 94. Mr. Kruk explained that his company would take care of leasing out the property and doing a credit check on new tenants for a fee of one month's rent. If the township was interested his company would also collect rent at a cost of 10% the rental fee or the township could be responsible. They would also be responsible for any maintenance issues that would come up regarding the home. If a necessary repair is under \$500.00,

the committee would not have to get involved. Mr. Kruk currently does this in Allamuchy Township for the last 6-7 years.

Mayor Starrs stated that she believes that the township attorney said that the township was unable to accept revenue from a rental but she will look into that. Committeeman Farber feels that this property should be held on to for future years.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Pam Rusweiler reached out to Senator Steve Oroho office to be a mediator between the township and the state so the township does not have to build a salt shed but purchase the salt from the state.

Committeeman Farber feels that a there should be a formal request to the senator from the township for support of sharing the state salt shed. DPW Supervisor Brian Peck stated that he knows that Blairstown shed does not have the capacity to share with Knowlton. He also stated that 2 years ago Knowlton DPW tried to borrow salt from the state. The state had also called Knowlton for when they ran out of salt. Supervisor Peck believes neither location has a shed large enough to hold enough salt for two towns.

SALT SHED

Mayor Starrs explained that there are two ideas for the salt shed, the first would be a shared service with the state or to move the current location of the salt shed. Mayor Starrs presented a list of properties to the committee at the prior meeting and none of the properties seemed to be suitable for a new salt shed. Mr. Peck feels that with good housekeeping and a new salt shed at the current location there will be no contamination outside the shed.

Motion was made by Committeeman Farber, seconded by Mayor Starrs and carried to approve to request the assistance of the legislatures for the shared service agreement for the salt shed.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

DPW Supervisor Brain Peck explained about the "paper" road off the municipal buildings parking lot. DPW does not maintain this road. Mr. Peck agreed to plow the paper road only during big storms.

Mr. Peck also talked to the committee about the y intersection at Brugler and Route 94. Mr. Peck called Alex Lazorisak, Supervisor of the Warren County Rd. Dept., regarding trucks using this and Mr. Lazorisak has agreed to do a shared service with DPW in removing the y intersection and fixing the pothole there.

Township Engineer Ted Rodman

Washington Street speed bump the Problem statement form is completed and will be sent to NJDOT. Cemetery Rd. -- Mr. Rodman has tried to contact Robin Blessing from Service Electric and has not heard back from her yet.

2017-48- Authorizing the Hiring of Sewer Engineer -Memorialize

WHEREAS, there exists a need for the performance of sewer engineering services during the year 2017 which cannot be handled by the Township Engineer; and

WHEREAS, funds are or will be made available for this purpose to be certified by the Treasurer; and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, *et seq.*, authorizes engaging a sewer engineer without competitive bidding providing that the Resolution authorizing the award of contracts for "Professional Services" without competitive bidding and the contracts be available for public inspection;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Knowlton, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. MARK A. BAHNICK, P.E., of VAN CLEEF ENGINEERING ASSOCIATES, ("Sewer Engineer") is hereby appointed to act as Sewer Engineer for the Township of Knowlton during the year 2017 in order to provide engineering services and advice relating to the Knowlton Wastewater Treatment Facility.
- 2. The Mayor and Clerk are authorized to execute a mutually agreeable written Agreement with said Sewer Engineer consistent with the terms of the Proposal within thirty (30) days of the date of this Resolution, subject to the Chief Financial Officer certifying there are adequate funds in the Township's budget to fund the agreement fee shall not exceed \$12,500.
- 3. This Agreement is awarded without competitive bidding as a "Professional Service" under the provision of the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5.
- 4. Adequate funds have been or will be appropriated for the services of Sewer Engineer as certified by the Chief Financial Officer up to an amount not exceeding \$12,500.00.

WHEREAS, the Knowlton Township will utilize the online auction services of EMEX, LLC, an approved vendor pursuant to the Act, waiver number EMEX LLC-1, located at www.energymarketexchange.com; and

WHEREAS, EMEX, LLC is compensated for all services rendered through the participating supplier that a contract is awarded to; and

WHEREAS, the auction will be conducted pursuant to the Act; and be it

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Knowlton Township Clerk: [Great Eastern Energy]; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Knowlton Township Committee of the Knowlton Township is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Knowlton Township any electricity contract proffered by the participating supplier that submits the winning bid in the EMEX Reverse Auction.

Century Link Petition

Committeewoman Shipps explained that this year CenturyLink will be merging with other companies some of which have Fiber optic. This merger must be approved by the Board of Public Utilities. Ms. Shipps will be starting a petition for residents to sign that asks the BPU not to approve the merger unless improvements in Internet are given to rural towns like Knowlton. The petition will be at the municipal building, online, and Ms. Shipps will have residents sign in person.

Fairview Schoolhouse
