PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Starrs had responded to resident Bob McNinch's comment from a prior meeting on township debt at the end of 2016 by email but wanted to respond in public session of this meeting. Mayor Starrs responded \$1.47 million was the township debt at the end of 2016, which is 0.484% of equalized value. For comparison, she presented a chart showing percentages for nearby towns' debt: Allamuchy 2.065%, Belvidere 1.286%, Hotpatcong 0.552%, Knowlton 0.484%, Blairstown 0.347%, and White: 0.00%.

OLD BUSINESS

622 Route 94

Attorney Leslie Parikh is going to check to see if Municipalities can accept a profit for renting out 622 Route 94.

NEW BUSINESS

Insurance Salt Coverage

Mayor Starrs explained that she has been negotiating with the insurance company and Chubb, the pollution insurance carrier, is now reserving its rights regarding coverage and requesting further investigation. They will not give a final decision regarding coverage until the six months after a notice of tort claim has been filed has passed.

Parking Ordinance Language

Attorney Leslie Parikh would like to take a look at the township Ordinance and speak with Zoning Officer Joe Rossi regarding the summons that was issued for parking violations.

Projector

Committee agreed to purchase a projector for presentations. Mayor Starrs, at Committeewoman Cuntala's suggestion, asked Superintendent Billotti if North Warren Regional High School could donate a used one later on during the meeting.

Logo Sign Meeting

Acting Clerk Shipps stated that a meeting is tentatively scheduled for May 23, 2017, 11: 00am at the Knowlton Municipal Building with the DOT regarding Route 80 signage.

Meeting with Bob Martin

Mayor Starrs and Committeeman Van Horn are meeting with NJDEP Commissioner Bob Martin tomorrow regarding grants for salt.

Delaware Beach Road

Mayor Starrs and DPW Supervisor Brian Peck will be meeting next week. Committeeman Farber asked if the signs at Station Rd. could be replaced.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Brian Peck-DPW Supervisor

1990 International truck cross bar is completely distorted and broke free from the frame. Mr. Peck is not sure if this snow plow can be fixed. Committeeman Van Horn will take a look at it.

Ted Rodman-Township Engineer

Mr. Rodman received a phone call from the engineer working on the gas station on the corner of Walnut Rd. They would like to put in an oil separator. Mr. Rodman believes that there should be a sight plan amendment.

Salt shed—The Committee agreed to use a hard design without a fabric roof. Mr. Rodman be coming up with estimates and dimensions.

PRESENTATION

Knowlton Township Fire and Rescue

EMS Captain David Neal and President Bob Peterson addressed the Township Committee regarding acquiring a new ambulance. Committeewoman Shipps and Committeeman Van Horn were present when the Fire & Rescue had a demonstration for a 2017 Ambulance. Fire & Rescue is also in need of a stretcher. Committeewoman Shipps looked into both leasing and financing for a new ambulance and a new stretcher. Cost for a new 2-wheel drive is \$138,000 or \$165,000 for a 4-wheel drive. Committeeman Van Horn also asked it St. Luke's would be willing to sell Knowlton Fire & Rescue a used ambulance. Committeewoman Shipps and Van Horn will gather more info.

Paul Avery Blairstown Rotary

Motion was made by Mayor Starrs, seconded by Deputy Mayor Cuntala and approved by Roll Call vote Cuntala--yes, Farber--yes, Shipps--yes, Van Horn--abstain, Starrs-- yes for Knowlton Township to donate \$750.00 for the Blairstown 4th of July Fireworks display, the same donation as the previous year.

North Warren School Budget

Superintendent Sarah Bilotti and Business Administrator Christopher Heagele presented the 2017-2018 North Warren School Budget. Handouts were provided to the Township Committee and audience. The presentation including budget goals, reducing costs, and current enrollment, which is steady but they are expecting a decrease in enrollment within the next few years. The school is "going to cap" or 2.00% this year. Knowlton's proportionate Share is 5.97%, which means an increase, for the average home valued at \$206,768, of \$9.87 per month. Some ideas and programs supported by the 2017-2018 budget are new schedule/unit lunch, Google Classroom Expansion, 1:1 laptops for all incoming 7th graders, replacing classroom projectors and an integrated security camera into single use.
